

How to make an interesting table game with toy cars?


We wanted to make a game with toy cars somehow but the game had to be in-door and on table. So we started to plan a in-door table game which uses toy cars somehow in it.


Plan: Background and Prior Work



Explanation: We wanted to make a table game with cars and related to soccer.


Fundamental Research
